



## Junior School (R-5) Curriculum Outline

Unity College Junior School strives to provide a caring and supportive learning community which caters for the needs of students from Reception to Year 5. ### Unity College and the Australian Curriculum

The Australian Curriculum is designed to develop successful learners, confident and creative individuals, and active and informed citizens. It is presented as a progression of learning from Reception to Senior School that makes it clear to parents, students and others in the wider community what is to be taught, and the quality of learning expected of young people as they progress through school. Students have access to the same

content across the nation, and their achievement can be judged against consistent national standards. Unity College and the teaching staff are responsible for the organisation of learning and will choose contexts for learning and plan paths that best meet students' needs and interests.

The Australian Curriculum also includes three current cross-curriculum priorities that are to

be addressed through the learning areas. These are: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories and Cultures; Asia and Australia's Engagement with Asia; and Sustainability. These priorities are addressed through various learning areas across the curriculum, not as separate subjects..
